

Continuity sets the standard

VENTING in Britain is so competitive that it is rare that one-horse riders win at international level. But David Britnell proved it is possible by taking CIC2* section C on his own Continuity in impressive fashion.

The pair led the dressage with a score of 44.2 and added nothing to that to hold their spot at the top of the leaderboard.

David, a 24-year-old freelance rider and instructor from Chesham, Bucks, bought the 12-year-old Contender gelding as a five-year-old.

"He was a failed showjumper and had a sarcoid, so we got him very cheaply," said David. "He's a very gentle horse who will try as hard as he can. But he's. different at a competition – as he's got older and wiser, he has

become sharp." Despite some consistently

good results, the pair had rarely showjumped clear until this season.

"I've had half a dozen lessons from John Whinnett, who has given me a system that works with this horse, and the difference is unreal," said David.

Second was Jodle Amos, giving Wise Crack a confidencegiving run after pulling up at Badminton. The pair finished on their dressage score of 45.9. "The ground was perfect so

we could have a good gallop, and it was nice to be able to experiment a bit with the dressage without too much pressure," said Jodie. Kitty King took the other CIC2* section on Vendredi Biats, who is owned by Diana Bown, Sally Eyre, Sally Lloyd-Baker and Samantha Wilson.

The seven-year-old also led from the word go and finished on his dressage score of 37.5 to collect his fourth win from his past five runs.

"This was his first CIC2* – his first novice win was here last year, so he's come quite a long way," said Kitty, "He's had an amzing spring, and he'll have a bit of a break now.

"He did a lovely test – it was accurate and he's a good mover, but he felt a little spooky, although that actually gave him expression. And for a sevenyear-old he made nothing of the cross-country. I hope he's my

THE 19-year-old scored his first intermediate victory in section M on Noreway Harry.

"He's only seven and this is his second infermediate," said Harry. "We weren't expecting this, but he digs deep and tries hard. He's the yard favourite – Mr Relaxed."

next really good horse."

Runners-up – again on their dressage mark – were Carlos Parro and the Kannan-sired 15-year-old Konito.

"His owner [Fiona Edwards] hunts him in the winter with the North Shropshire and I play with him in the summer," said Carlos. Mark Phillips' bold, flowing

intermediate section O comfortably.

"I got a late entry here to give him a nice run before the CCI4" at Luhmühlen," said Louise. "Adam Kemp has been helping me on the flat since the end of last year and it is paying off. I'm trying to rice Whiltson more forward — he tends to work in really well and then go a bit flat in the arena."

Ibby Macpherson and Ballingowan Echo won open intermediate section P, adding a showjump down to their dressage of 23.9.

"He's a bit like a Labrador puppy, and is a pleasure in every way," said lbby. "He did the best test he's ever done today, and was incredible across country."

Andrew Hoy and Cheeky Calimbo took the advanced intermediate. "It was a last-minute entry

after what happened at Betton [Andrew's addle slipped badly towards the end of the crosscountry when they were in a competitive position] – and was a bit of test of everything before the CIC3* at Lumbinilen." said Andrew. "He's the most difficult horse! I've had fo it a saddle to, because he's shaped a bit like a greyhound, and I've added a stockman's breastplate.

"I didn't set out to get the time, just to have a good canter round, but he was picking the fences off in a really nice rhythm and I was two seconds under the time."
